The Pet Page

One of The Most Misunderstood Creatures

Opossums (sometimes pronounced 'possums) have scruffy fur, flinty eyes, bizarre little feet, and a long, scaly tail. And this is their good side. Threaten one of them, and it will bare its teeth, hiss, and drool.

As disgusting as the animals may appear, they actually do quite lovely work in the garden. Opossums are nature's clean-up crew, working the graveyard shift. Like little dust busters, they cruise the landscape, round ears tilted like satellite dishes, with their fleshy pink snoots to the ground. They feast on snails and slugs, perhaps even a cockroach or two.

Gardeners may blame opossums for the messes and mischief made by rambunctious raccoons, skunks, and squirrels rooting out insect grubs, but the reality is that opossums don't dig. They can't. The soft pink skin on their paws is too delicate for such manual labor. Their weak nails are built for climbing trees. Though they are excellent at scaling



trunks, they rarely sample the fruit above. Instead, they might salvage a fallen peach or munch avocados knocked down by squirrels, but they actually prefer their produce at ground level and well-rotted — all the easier to sniff out as they forage the night garden.

IF opossums are so docile, harmless, and downright helpful, then why are so many people — even sensitive gardeners who have designed their landscapes to attract wildlife — so intensely repulsed by this animal? The average person thinks they're so ugly, that they're scary. In truth, the opossum is one of the gentlest animals out there. When it senses danger, it usually just freezes, motionless, and waits for the hazard to pass. When threatened, they can look awfully mean, but it's all a big show. They don't run or bite well, and they're not very coordinated. If the baring-teeth-and-hissing drama doesn't work, they feign death by entering a temporary coma.



Preparing for your pet is a crucial part of any family disaster plan. Your dog can't remind you to grab her heartworm medication, your cat can't make sure you've remembered his litter and your ferret certainly can't help you find a pet-friendly shelter in your area.

Create your pet emergency supply kit. This kit should contain everything your pet will need, from food and water to medication and toys. Regularly update your kit to ensure that the items stay fresh. You might also consider packing a second, lighter kit that you bring with you when you travel.

Create your plan. If an evacuation of our area is ever necessary, where will you and your family go? Ideally, shelters in our area will be pet-friendly, but that isn't always the case. Try to identify places where your pets can safely stay during an emergency.

Stay up-to-date. One of the most valuable preparation steps you can take is being informed. And finally, the **RABIES** fear is unfounded because the disease is rarely found in opossums, says Catherine Conlon, a veterinarian and rabies specialist formerly with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and recently named director of the rabies lab at Kansas State University.

This apparent resistance to rabies may be attributed to the opossum's low body temperature, which prevents buildup of the rabies virus.

Let's hope this helps some of you who didn't understand these wonderful little creatures. Every animal has a purpose!
