Never Buy Celery Again

You can re-grow organic celery from the base of the bunch you bought from the store a couple of weeks ago. It's amazing how resourceful we can be when we try.

Simply chop the celery stalk froms the base of the celery bunch. Instead of tossing the base (see photo to right), which most people do, rinse it off and place in a small saucer or bowl of warm water on or near a sunny windowsill with base side down and cut stalks facing upright.

Let the celery base hang out in the saucer of water for about one week, changing the water every



couple of days. Over the course of the week, the surrounding stalks will begin to dry out significantly, but the tiny little yellow leaves from the center of the base will begin thickening and growing up and out from the center, turning a dark green. The growth will be slow, but steady and evident.



After 5-7 days, transfer the celery base to a recycled planter like the oatmeal tin in photo, or directly outside depending on time of year, and cover it completely (except for the new leaf tips) with a mixture of dirt and potting soil and continue to water—generously. Not only will you have celery leaves regenerating themselves from the base, but you will see stalks making their way up and out of the soil.

Sure, this process isn't as convenient as riding your bike to the local farmer's market for a quick celery fix, but it's a rewarding experiment and perfect for teaching children patience and respect for the rewards of gardening. When planting celery from seed, the growing process can take 5 or more months to reach desired stalk size. There are many other foods you can

grow from leftovers — ginger root, garlic, sweet potatoes, green onions, lettuce, etc. Read the book entitled, "Don't Throw It, Grow It!" which details 68 windowsill plants you can grow from kitchen scraps. Happy recycling.... and bon appetite!

Grammatical Difference Between "Me" and "I"

Perhaps you wince at the decline of correct grammar these days, or perhaps it doesn't matter at all. However, good grammar is credibility, whether in a newsletter or especially on the internet (blog posts, Facebook, emails, company websites, etc.) And, for better or worse, people will judge you if you can't tell the difference between I and Me, or the difference between Their, There, and They're. Here are some helpful tips:

If you were to say, "Barbara and I went to the party" it would be correct. "Barbara and me went to the party" would be incorrect. Think of it this way: eliminate "Barbara" so it would be "I went to the party" not "me went to the party." Basically, eliminate the other person(s) to see if the sentence makes sense.

They're = they are (They're going to the gym.)
Their = shows possession (The gym is owned by their family.)
There = specifies a location (The gym is over there, near the freeway.)
