There was a couple who had just celebrated their golden wedding anniversary with a big party. After presents were exchanged, and congratulations were expressed, they got in their car and drove home. Once





An EXTRA day!

'Leap Day' is February 29, which is an extra day added during a Leap Year, making the year 366 days long — and not 365 days, like a common year.

Brief History: Seasons and astronomical events do not repeat at an exact number of full days, so a calendar which has the same number of days in each year would, over time, drift with respect to the event it was supposed to track. By occasionally inserting (or intercalating) an additional day or month into the year, the drift can be corrected. If we didn't add a day on February 29 every four years, we would lose almost six hours every year. After only 100 years, our calendar would be off by approximately 24 days!



Leap Day Traditions and Trivia:

- According to an old Irish legend, St. Bridget struck a deal with St. Patrick to allow women to propose to men and not just the other way around every 4 years. This is believed to have been introduced to balance the traditional roles of men and women in a similar way to how Leap Day balances the calendar.
- A person born on February 29 may be called a "leapling". In common years they usually celebrate their birthdays on February 28 or March 1.
- In Scotland, it was once considered unlucky for someone to be born on Leap Day. In Greece, it's said to be unlucky for couples to marry during a Leap Year, and especially on Leap Day.

Your local AARP chapter office is offering FREE tax preparation assistance. The program is provided mainly for **senior citizens** and also **some low-income taxpayers**. You do not need to be a member of AARP to benefit from this service.

Beginning in January 2012, you can call or visit for information and to schedule an appointment. The office is located at 3713 Tibbetts (just off Brockton, near Arlington) and is open from 9:00 a.m. to noon, on Mondays and Thursdays, and the phone is (951) 682-1416.



Different parts of Riverside have been experiencing localized increases in vehicle burglaries and theft of items from houses and yards. Lock your car, even while at home, and do not leave anything of value in sight. When you see suspicious activity (like someone riding thru the neighborhood on a bike or skateboard while scoping out the houses, or someone selling items door-to-door, etc.), call the police non-emergency number: (951) 787-7911.
If it's an active crime, call 911. Call 311 if you're reporting graffiti, streetlights out, potholes, shopping carts, etc.

The police do not have the manpower to patrol our neighborhood constantly, so we need to be their eyes and ears. Call if something does not look right. Don't assume someone else will call; they may assume the same thing. If the dispatch operator is reluctant to dispatch an officer, please tell them, "Lieutenant Manning said I should call". FIV: Catching a Bad Case of Rumors

FIV stands for Feline Immunodeficiency Virus. It's a lentivirus, meaning that it progresses very slowly, gradually affecting a cat's immune system. It is passed through blood transfusions and through serious, penetrating bite wounds — mainly by stray, intact tomcats. The most well-known lentivirus in humans is HIV. But the two are not at all the same, and you can't get FIV from a cat. In fact, the only thing about FIV that you can catch is a bad case of the rumors!

As long as cats with FIV are not exposed to diseases that their immune system can't handle, they can live perfectly normal, and long, happy, healthy lives. And they can only pass the virus on to other cats through a serious, penetrating bite wound. So unless your cats at home routinely tear each other to pieces, it's not a problem. And if your cats are tearing each other up, that's probably a bigger problem anyway!

FIV Facts

- 1) The Feline Immunodeficiency Virus is a slow virus that affects a cat's immune system over a period of years.
- 2) FIV is a cat-only disease and cannot be spread to humans or other non-felines.
- 3) FIV cats most often live long, healthy, and relatively normal lives with no symptoms at all.
- 4) FIV is not easily passed between cats. It cannot be spread casually like in litter boxes, water and food bowls, or when snuggling and playing. It is rarely spread from a mother to her kittens.
- 5) The virus can be spread through blood transfusions, badly infected gums, or serious penetrating bite wounds. Bit wounds of this kind are extremely rare, except in free-roaming unneutered tomcats.
- 6) A neutered cat, in a home, is extremely unlikely to infect other cats, if properly introduced.
- 7) Many vets are not educated about FIV since the virus was only discovered about 15 years ago.
- 8) FIV-positive cats should be kept as healthy as possible. Keep them indoors and free from stress, feed them a high-quality diet, keep them vaccinated, and treat any secondary health problems as soon as they arise.
