Don't Be a Tosser

It is estimated that several *trillion* cigarette butts are littered worldwide every year. That's billions of cigarettes flicked, one at a time, on our sidewalks, beaches, nature trails, gardens, and other public places every single day. In fact, cigarettes are **the most littered item in America** and the world. Cigarette filters are made



of cellulose acetate, not cotton, and they can take decades to degrade. Those who think that tossing cigarettes is not littering — think again! Even tobacco giant Philip Morris USA says cigarettes are the most common form of litter (http://www.philipmorrisusa.com/policies_practices/litter.asp). Littering of any sort is disgusting, but when your discards are also burning, there can be consequences, such as when a cigarette flies into someone's open convertible and results in an accident, or when it goes into the back of a pickup truck, where it ignites paper bags full of groceries. Some folks will say these instances are rare. Perhaps, but wildfires aren't uncommon, especially this time of year. Ask anyone who has

lost their home — or a loved one — if cigarettes are harmless. Maybe more fires are started because of arson rather than careless smokers, but there's still the issue of cigarette litter.

Assemblyman Russ Bough, R-Yucaipa, came up with a bill (AB2694) that would increase the fine for tossing a lighted or unlighted cigarette out of a vehicle's window, or discarding one on private property outside of an

ashtray. The bill was first introduced February 20, 2004 and had the support of California Department of Forestry & Fire Protection firefighters, the Sierra Club, the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department and the environmental organization Vote the Coast. There are notes from a May 4, 2004 hearing regarding the bill's status (http://www.leginfo.ca.gov/pub/bill/asm/ab_2651-2700/ab_2694_cfa_20040503_143312_asm_comm.html). The summary



states that the mandatory minimum fine would rise from its current \$100 to up to \$2,000 for a first offense. For a second conviction, the minimum fine would change from \$500 to up to \$4,000. Three or more convictions and the fine could be as much as \$6,000. Smokers will be thrilled to learn the bill did not pass because the committee felt the penalty was too harsh for the crime. The majority of the committee must be smokers!

The Benefits of Cycling Helmets

Bicycle helmets are 85-88 percent effective in mitigating head and brain injuries, making the use of helmets the single most effective way to reduce head injuries and fatalities resulting from bicycle crashes. Despite the fact that 70 to 80 percent of all fatal bicycle crashes involve head injuries, only 18 percent of all bicyclists wear bicycle helmets.

Selecting and fitting a bike helmet

• Choose a bike helmet that meets current safety standards. Most helmets are made of EPS foam with a thin plastic outer shell. The shell helps the helmet skid easily on rough pavement to avoid jerking the neck. The shell also holds the EPS together after the first impact. Some excellent helmets are made by molding EPS in the shell rather than adding the shell later.



- Fit the helmet so the front is just above the top of the eyebrows. Teach your child to wear it this way.
- Adjust the two side straps so they meet in a "V" right under each ear, and check often to make sure straps stay snug and the helmet stays level on the head.
- Adjust the chin strap snugly under the chin. Make it tight enough so the helmet pulls down when you
 open your mouth. The helmet should not move more than an inch in any direction, and must not pull
 off no matter how hard you try.
- Standards are no longer a big issue in the US market, but check inside for a CPSC sticker.
- Pick white or a bright color for visibility to be sure that motorists and other cyclists can see you.
- Ponytail ports can improve fit for those with long hair.
- Bald riders should avoid helmets with big top vents in order to prevent funny tan lines.
- Some head shapes require more fiddling with fitting pads and straps. Extra small heads may need thick fitting pads.
- For a softer landing, seniors should pick a thicker, less dense model without huge vents.

Many people buy their helmets after a crash. You can be smarter than that. Happy cycling!!!
