The Pet Page

I Found a Stray Dog — What Do I Do?

First, consider the safety of the dog and yourself. A frightened and possibly sick or injured dog may behave unpredictably. If the dog appears approachable, use caution and common sense. Speak calmly and perhaps entice him by offering a morsel of food. Assume, no matter how the dog behaves or what it looks like, that he is owned by someone who wants him back. This is the basis for "think lost, not stray".

* Dogs who run from strangers are often mistaken as having been "abused", but they may be predisposed to being skittish and their behavior has nothing to do with how they've been treated. A lost dog will lose weight, become dehydrated, obtain injuries, become matted, and pick up fleas. Don't assume the dog was abandoned until you have concrete evidence or until all efforts to find an owner have failed.



- * If you can keep the dog for a little while, take it to any vet's office and have it scanned for a microchip. Check the "lost & found" ads in the newspaper. Post a giant fluorescent FOUND DOG poster (28" x 22") with your phone number at major intersections in the area where found.
- * By law, you are required to turn found dogs over to local authorities (animal shelter, pound) where their owner will be able to claim them. One of the primary reasons lost dogs are not reunited with their families is that the animal shelter is the first (and primary) location where dog owners search for their lost dogs but it is typically the last location where found dogs are taken (due to the fear that the dog will be euthanized). Very few shelters have the resources available to house lost and stray animals more than three days. If you are not willing to take the dog to the shelter, most shelters will allow you to foster the dog while also filing a found report by providing the description and your contact information.
- * If you decide to put up numerous FOUND DOG flyers, partially describe the dog so all callers will be forced to identify the dog. Deliver the flyers to rescue groups, vet offices, and pet supply stores in your area.

The moment you stop searching for your lost pet is the moment that your chances of a happy reunion plummet. Your biggest enemies will be discouragement and a lack of hope!


