HISTORY AND CUSTOMS OF HALLOWEEN

Halloween is an annual celebration, but just what is it actually a celebration of? And how did this peculiar custom originate? Is it, as some claim, a kind of demon worship? Or is it just a harmless vestige of some ancient pagan ritual?

The word itself, "Halloween," actually has its origins in the Catholic Church. It comes from a contracted corruption of All Hallows Eve. November 1, "All Hollows Day" (or "All Saints Day"), is a Catholic day of observance in honor of saints. But, in the 5th century BC, in Celtic Ireland, summer officially ended on October 31. The holiday was called Samhain (sow-en), the Celtic New year.

One story says that, on that day, the disembodied spirits of all those who had died throughout the preceding year would come back in search of living bodies to possess for the next year. It was believed to be their only hope for the afterlife. The Celts believed all laws of space and time were suspended during this time, allowing the spirit world to intermingle with the living.

Naturally, the still-living did not want to be possessed. So on the night of October 31, villagers would extinguish the fires in their homes, to make them cold and undesirable. They would then dress up in all manner of ghoulish costumes and noisily paraded around the neighborhood, being as destructive as possible in order to frighten away spirits looking for bodies to possess.

The thrust of the practices also changed over time to become more ritualized. As belief in spirit possession waned, the practice of dressing up like hobgoblins, ghosts, and witches took on a more ceremonial role. The custom of Halloween was brought to America in the 1840's by Irish immigrants fleeing their country's potato famine. At that time, the favorite pranks in New England included tipping over outhouses and unhinging fence gates.

The custom of trick-or-treating is thought to have originated not with the Irish Celts, but with a ninth-century European custom called souling. On November 2, All Souls Day, early Christians would walk from



village to village begging for "soul cakes," made out of square pieces of bread with currants. The more soul cakes the beggars would receive, the more prayers they would promise to say on behalf of the dead relatives of the donors. At the time, it was believed that the dead remained in limbo for a time after death, and that prayer, even by strangers, could expedite a soul's passage to heaven.

So, although some cults may have adopted Halloween as their favorite "holiday," the day itself did not grow out of evil practices. It grew out of the

rituals of Celts celebrating a new year, and out of Medieval prayer rituals of Europeans. Halloween in the United States lost most of its superstitious and religious overtones by the Beginning of the 20th century. There was a move to mold Halloween into a holiday more about community and neighborly gettogethers. As a result, family parties and large community celebrations gained popularity. Then in the 1950s, with the baby boom in full force, Halloween evolved into a holiday directed mainly at the young.

Today, many communities sponsor costume parades, dances, skits, and other forms of entertainment to celebrate Halloween. Adults are again dressing up and having parties of their own. Americans spend \$2.5 billion annually on Halloween, making it the country's second largest commercial holiday.

And today, even many churches have Halloween parties or pumpkin carving events for the kids. After all, the day itself is only as evil as one cares to make it.

Eat Your Crusts!

Make your children eat the crust. Force *yourself* to eat the crust, for that matter. Bread crust, when eaten, helps the body defend itself from carcinogens.

The crust contains an antioxidant called pronyllysine, which is effective in boosting certain enzymes

boosting certain enzymes known as Phase II enzymes. And darker bread usually contains more of these carcinogen-fighting enzymes than white bread.

A study was conducted by German scientists who baked sourdough bread using a mixture of wheat and rye flour, and discovered there was eight times as much pronyl-lysine in the crust than in the less-baked center of the loaf.

Report Missing Cell Phones Immediately!



If your cell phone is lost or stolen, report it ASAP. If you don't, you could be held responsible for the charges. According to one wireless service provider's terms of

unauthorized usage, if your device, user name or password is stolen, or service is fraudulently used, you must immediately notify them and provide police reports that the phone was indeed stolen.

Until you notify them, you will likely be held responsible for the charges incurred. But don't worry about having to notify friends and family of a new cell phone number; most service providers will block usage of the number until the phone is recovered, and then can reinstate the number.


